# Prime Time Rhyme

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Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes

Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers

Suitable for visually impaired players.

## Overview:

There are three answers to each question .... and they all rhyme!

## Instructions:

1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
2. Read the first three definitions. Discussion is permitted among teammates. Prior to the start of the game, a method to signal when a team is ready to answer must be determined. Ringing bells and New Year's blowers are just two inexpensive noisemakers. Raised hands work, but the host must be vigilant to watch for whose hand went up first. The host always has the final say in any disputes.
3. After a player/team is recognized as the first to signal, they may give an answer. If the first answer is incorrect, the other teams may 'buzz' in and answer.
4. Scoring: Give 10 points for each correct answer.

1. A detective; Veracity; What, according to the old proverb, is wasted on the young
2. Extreme anger; An actor's milieu; A parakeet's home
3. Brutal and pitiless; A round loaf of crusty bread; Emerald or ruby, for example
4. Nathaniel Hawthorne's famous house had seven of them; Aesop's specialty; Where horses live
5. To behave coquettishly; Mini or dirndl; Mr. Bacharach, the composer
6. A humorous imitation or parody; Mistake or blunder; Evidence needed to support an assertion
7. A hank of yarn; Where you will find Kennebunkport; Amtrak's rolling stock
8. Associations formed between countries or organizations for mutual benefit; Physics, chemistry, and biology, collectively; Dishwashers, refrigerators, and ovens, for example
9. Second-largest city in Spain; Grand Canyon state; Ms. Ryder, the actress
10. A type of mushroom that's often poisonous; To share an automobile ride back and forth to work; Private (often expensive) educational institution that readies students for college
11. Adds flour or corn starch; Domestic fowls; Author of *Oliver Twist*
12. To compel observance or compliance with the law; Deep regret or guilt for a wrongdoing; To dissolve a marriage
