Visual Trivia Quiz

Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes

Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Print the QUESTIONS pages (i.e., the images), or project them onto a screen or

monitor.

Overview:

Each of the five categories in this visual trivia quiz contains six pictures. Initially, you should see if your players can identify the images without hearing the clues provided at the bottom of each sheet. If they can't, then read the clue related to each image.

Instructions

- 1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
- 2. Point out the first image (labeled A). See if anyone can come up with a correct answer without hearing the clue underneath. Score 20 points if someone identifies that image correctly.
- 3. If the clue is needed, read the clue that goes with the image.
- 4. Discussion is permitted among teammates.
- 5. Prior to the start of the game, a method to signal when a team is ready to answer must be determined. Ringing bells and New Year's blowers are just two inexpensive noisemakers. Raised hands work, but the host must be vigilant to watch for whose hand went up first. The host always has the final say in any disputes.
- 6. After a player/team is recognized as the first to signal, they may give an answer. If the first answer is incorrect, the other teams may "buzz" in and answer.
- 7. Scoring: Give 10 points for each correct answer given when the clue is read.

- E. Five weeks after knee surgery, this spunky US gymnast won 5 medals in the 1984 Olympics.









- B. This ice skater went on to win silver in the 1994 Winter Olympics after being attacked by a rival.




