# **Overview:**

# **Instructions**

- 1. Create a tournament format in which permanent teams compete in playoffs and a final champion team is crowned.
- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

- 10 Pts This toy, introduced in 1945, was packaged as the "famous walking spring toy."
- 20 Pts This toy was patented in 1943 as a "putty-like elastic plastic, siloxane derivative composition containing zinc hydroxide."
- 30 Pts This board game, where you'll visit the Lollipop Woods and the Peanut Brittle House, was designed for the littlest players and requires no reading.
- 40 Pts In the 1960's, Mattel introduced the "perfect date" and Hasbro introduced the "perfect soldier." Can you name these two classic male dolls?
- 50 Pts Early names for this toy were Flying Saucer and Pluto Platter until 1958 when the Wham-O company trademarked this name that's still in use today.

- 40 Pts In 1996, this actor was the first African American "Sexiest Man." He's known for his portrayals of real-life characters, including Malcolm X in 1992.
- 50 Pts In 1989, this actor was the first (and only) Scottish winner. He was also the oldest, at age 59.
