## Overview:

## Instructions

2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

- 10 Pts It begins with *Genesis* and ends with *Malachi*.
- 20 Pts This classic children's book about a Texas family and their dog was published in 1956. Disney made the movie two years later.
- 30 Pts In the late 19<sup>th</sup> century, this geological wonder was often used as a hot water laundry by visitors to Yellowstone National Park.
