Fast Five

Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes
 Number of players: Unlimited
 Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers
 Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

Fill in the blank space to complete **FIVE** words, names, phrases, idioms, or sayings that begin with or end with the given clue.

For example, take the clue: _____ *SHIRT*

Some possible correct answers include: *Flannel shirt, Hawaiian shirt, Lose one's shirt, Polo shirt, Stuffed shirt, Sweatshirt, T-shirt, Undershirt, etc.*

Some incorrect answers would be: *Shirtsleeves, Shirtwaist, Shirttail, etc.* These answers are incorrect because a correct answer has to **come before** the word *SHIRT*, and in those examples, the word *SHIRT* comes after the blank space in the clue. Another example of an incorrect answer would be *Orange shirt*. That is an incorrect answer because, while a person could have an orange shirt, it is NOT a common name, phrase, idiom, or saying.

Here's another example: *CITY* _____

Some possible correct answers are: *Citywide, City of Brotherly Love, City limit, City Hall, City council, etc.*

Some incorrect answers would be: *Capacity, Electricity, Felicity, etc.* These answers are incorrect for two reasons: 1) While they do end with the letters C-I-T-Y, they don't end with the **word** *CITY*; and 2) Since the word *CITY* precedes the blank space in the clue, a correct answer has to **come after** the word *CITY*.

Instructions:

1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
2. Select one team to begin, read the clue – i.e., *(Blank) SHIRT* or *CITY (Blank)* – and start the one-minute timer.
3. The player/team must provide **FIVE** correct answers. (Teams can work together.) If five correct answers are not given, the other team(s) may “buzz” in and answer.
4. Scoring: Give 50 points to the person/team that successfully comes up with five correct answers.

Note: In this particular game, the clues are related. Therefore, if you (or your team) come up with an answer for *FIRST*, you can't use the same answer for *SECOND*, *THIRD*, or *LAST*. For example, if you use *FIRST FLOOR*, you can't use *SECOND FLOOR* or *THIRD FLOOR* for your own subsequent answers.
