Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers

Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

You already know how to play trivia quizzes. Here are a few additional ideas to consider if you want a more, or less, competitive game.

Instructions

- 1. Create a tournament format in which permanent teams compete in playoffs and a final champion team is crowned.
- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

MOVIE ENDINGS

- 10 Pts This 1940 movie ends with Rick Blaine telling Captain Renault, "Louis, I think this is the beginning of a beautiful friendship."
- 20 Pts In this 1941 film, the last shot is of a burning sled.
- 30 Pts At the end of this 1959 comedy, Daphne rips off her wig and reveals her true gender to her suitor Osgood Fielding. "I'm a man!" he shouts. A determined Osgood simply responds, "Well, nobody's perfect."
- 40 Pts At the end of this 1991 film, escaped cannibalistic serial killer Hannibal Lechter calls Clarice and tells her that he's "having an old friend for dinner."

1952
