Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes

Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers

Maybe be suitable for visually impaired players (with some assistance).

Overview:

Homework games usually differ from our typical game formats in that they are meant for individual play and will often require pencil and paper to solve. However, with a little adaptation, you can usually use them for group play as well. For homework games, we recommend that you hand out the game page (but not the answers) for your players to take home. Perhaps you can post the answers on a bulletin board or in the elevator a couple of days later.

Instructions:

This is a two-part challenge: a trivia quiz and a word jumble centered on a particular theme. The theme of this game is **FICTIONAL ANIMALS**.

On the next page, you'll find a letter grid and a series of questions. Each correct answer will relate in some way to a well known animal from fiction. As you answer the questions, cross out each letter of the answers in the grid. (The number in parentheses indicates how many letters are found in the correct answer.)

For example, if the category were **DESSERTS**, with the question: *In the United States, this sweet treat is called a cookie; what is it called in Britain? (7)*, the answer would be *BISCUIT*. You would then cross out each letter of **B-I-S-C-U-I-T** in the grid.

IMPORTANT NOTE: After all the trivia questions have been answered and the letters have been crossed out, rearrange the remaining letters (the ones in the grid that are not crossed out) to reveal another **FICTIONAL ANIMAL**.
