## **Overview:**

You already know how to play trivia quizzes. Here are a few additional ideas to consider if you want a more, or less, competitive game.

## **Instructions**

- 1. Create a tournament format in which permanent teams compete in playoffs and a final champion team is crowned.
- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

#### **NEW ENGLAND**

#### **WORLD FOOD**

- 10 Pts This flat unleavened bread, traditionally made from finely ground corn, has been a Mexican staple food since before the 13th century.
- 20 Pts Hummus, one of the world's oldest foods, can be traced back to ancient Egypt. What is the main ingredient of hummus?
- 30 Pts The classic version of this rich Sicilian pastry is filled with sweetened ricotta cheese.
- 40 Pts Quiche Lorraine is a specific type of quiche that contains egg, cream, and which two other main ingredients?
- 50 Pts Paella (pronounced pie•EH•ya) which usually contains mussels, lobster, shrimp, cuttlefish, and rice, is often considered the unofficial national dish of this country.

- 10 Pts In 1949, this 49-year-old author of *Gone with the Wind* was struck and killed by an automobile in Atlanta.
- 20 Pts In 1949, the first law under this new South African political system was passed banning mixed race marriages.
- 30 Pts On October 21, 1949, this current Prime Minister of Israel was born in Tel Aviv. He spent much of his youth living in the US, graduating from a suburban Philadelphia high school and attending college at both MIT and Harvard.
- 40 Pts In 1949, the country of Siam officially changes its name to this the name that it's known by today.
- 50 Pts On June 8, 1949, this George Orwell novel was published. It was set 35 years into the future in a world at perpetual war, and in a country with an oppressive government led by Big Brother.
