Before & After

Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes

Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers

Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

This quiz employs a variation of a popular format that has been used in TV's Wheel of Fortune for the last quarter-century. You will be given two definitions for two phrases or names that share one word at the end of one answer and at the beginning of another. For example: Long-running TV game show, and a common small "dessert" in a Chinese restaurant. Answer: Wheel of Fortune Cookie, which combines Wheel of Fortune and Fortune Cookie.

Instructions:

- 1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
- 2. Read the first clues aloud. Discussion is permitted among teammates. Prior to the start of the game, a method to signal when a team is ready to answer must be determined. Ringing bells and New Year's blowers are just two inexpensive noisemakers. Raised hands work, but the host must be vigilant to watch for whose hand went up first. The host always has the final say in any disputes.
- 3. After a player/team is recognized as the first to signal, they may give an answer. If the first answer is incorrect, the other teams may "buzz" in and answer.
- 4. Scoring: Give 10 points for each correct answer.



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Instructions: Each answer in this quiz will share a single word that connects the end of one answer and the beginning of another.

- 6. The actor who played Gomez Addams in the early 1990s *Addams Family* films, and the TV chef who introduced French cooking to American households.
- 7. Soft-serve ice cream chain, and Britain's longest-serving monarch.
- 8. Pioneering late night talk show host, and Beat Generation poet and author of "Howl."
- 9. The actress whose early roles included the Flying Nun, and Kevin Costner's mystical baseball movie.
- 10. The patriot who demanded that he be given either liberty or death, and the "father" of the modern assembly line.
- 11. The singer/songwriter whose hits include "For Once in My Life" and "You Are the Sunshine of My Life," and the original sliced loaf.
- 12. Kissing this feature of an ancient Irish castle, according to legend, endows one with the gift of gab, and the former co-host of *Dateline NBC*, primarily covering stories of crime and murder.
- 13. The younger son of Ozzie and Harriet, and the unelected vice president under Gerald Ford.
- 14. That Girl, and the third president of the United States.
