Overview:

You already know how to play trivia quizzes. Here are a few additional ideas to consider if you want a more, or less, competitive game.

Instructions

- 1. Create a tournament format in which permanent teams compete in playoffs and a final champion team is crowned.
- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

REALLY OLD THINGS

- 10 Pts Construction on this English Abbey commenced in 902. It was rebuilt 140 years later by King Edward the Confessor to provide himself with a royal burial church; and rebuilt yet again in 1245 by Henry III, who also wanted to be buried there.
- 20 Pts Construction of this famous sports arena, built in the heart of Rome to host gladiatorial spectacles, began in 70AD.
- 30 Pts This immense, ivory-white marble mausoleum located in the city of Agra was commissioned in 1632, but is not the oldest building in India by a long shot. The Great Stupa in Madhya Pradesh is older by nearly 2,000 years.
- 40 Pts With perhaps the exception of the pyramids, this colossal limestone statue is the most recognizable symbol of ancient Egypt.
- 50 Pts The oldest surviving thermometer in the world was built by this German physicist in 1718. (The temperature scale he used now carries his name.)

- 10 Pts The title of this supreme Russian leader is often spelled with either a "c" or a "t."
- 20 Pts The rise of this far-right, nationalistic party in the 1920s is often blamed on the humiliation the Germans suffered after WWI as a result of the Treaty of Versailles.
- 30 Pts This rice-shaped pasta is commonly used in soups.
- 40 Pts This insect sound is often cited as an example of onomatopoeia.
- 50 Pts This anise-flavored aperitif is popular worldwide but is primarily associated with Greece and Cyprus.

- 10 Pts The plantain (plan•TANE) is this type of plant.
- 20 Pts Maple, juniper, and even redwood trees are used in this Japanese botanical art, whose name means "plant in a tray."
- 30 Pts The state of Georgia produces more than 40% of the US output of this misnamed legume.
- 40 Pts The common name for this carnivorous plant comes from the Roman goddess of love, plus one of the plant's favorite foods although it also eats crickets and spiders.
- 50 Pts This poisonous plant, which grows wild in the United States, was fatal to Socrates.
