Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers

Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

This quiz explores some of the news and current events that occurred last week.

Instructions:

- 1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
- 2. Read the first question. Discussion is permitted among teammates. Prior to the start of the game, a method to signal when a team is ready to answer must be determined. Ringing bells and New Year's blowers are just two inexpensive noisemakers. Raised hands work, but the host must be vigilant to watch for whose hand went up first. The host always has the final say in any disputes.
- 3. After a player/team is recognized as the first to signal, they may give an answer. If the first answer is incorrect, the other teams may 'buzz' in and answer.
- 4. Scoring: Give 10 points for each correct answer.

- 4. Two crime videos were released last week. Particularly hard to watch was the shocking body camera video of the five policemen in Memphis beating Tyre Nichols to death. The other video captured this San Francisco crime.
- 5. Roughly a dozen classified documents were discovered last week in the home of this former office holder.
- 6. In addition to the United States, which country announced that it will send tanks to Ukraine, following weeks of diplomatic pressure to do so?
- 7. Which brand of candy is temporarily retiring its animated character mascots and replacing them as spokes "persons" with real actress Maya Rudolph?
- 8. The Senate Judiciary Committee held a hearing last week on Ticketmaster's hold over the entertainment industry, after the company bungled sales for this megastar musician's latest tour.
- 9. What US Representative from Arizona announced last week that he will seek the Senate seat held by Kyrsten Sinema?
- 10. After being removed from the House Intelligence Committee by Speaker of the House Kevin McCarthy, this US Representative from California announced that he will be seeking the Senate seat currently held by Dianne Feinstein, who is expected to retire next year.
