Weekly Trivia Quiz

Estimated play time: Approximately 20 minutes

Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Scoring board/pad; noisemakers

Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

You already know how to play trivia quizzes. Here are a few additional ideas to consider if you want a more, or less, competitive game.

Instructions

- 1. Create a tournament format in which permanent teams compete in playoffs and a final champion team is crowned.
- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.



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QUESTIONS

PETERS, PAULS, OR MARYS

- 10 Pts This ringleader of the 1773 Boston Tea Party also took a famous horseback ride from Boston to Lexington in 1775.
- 20 Pts This singer-songwriter is known worldwide for his 1960's and 1970's hits "Bridge Over Troubled Water," "Mrs. Robinson," and "The Sound of Silence."
- 30 Pts Although he was born in Canada, he became one American TV's "Big Three" news anchors of the 1980's and 1990's.
- This Mary was the real-life mother of actor Larry Hagman (J.R. Ewing from the 1980's TV show *Dallas*). But she was a legendary actress herself, having originated both the role of Peter Pan in the 1954 Broadway musical adaptation (later seen on US television as well) and, in 1959, the role of Maria in *The Sound of Music*.
- 50 Pts In the late 19th century, this Mary founded Christian Science, a new religion that taught that sickness is an illusion that can only be corrected by prayer.

- 20 Pts The Baby Boom Generation listened to the music of these insects.
- 30 Pts You might unclog your tub drain with this reptile.
