Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

This quiz explores some of the news and current events that occurred last week.

Instructions:

- 1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
- 2. Read the first question. Discussion is permitted among teammates. Prior to the start of the game, a method to signal when a team is ready to answer must be determined. Ringing bells and New Year's blowers are just two inexpensive noisemakers. Raised hands work, but the host must be vigilant to watch for whose hand went up first. The host always has the final say in any disputes.
- 3. After a player/team is recognized as the first to signal, they may give an answer. If the first answer is incorrect, the other teams may 'buzz' in and answer.
- 4. Scoring: Give 10 points for each correct answer.

A few of Project 2025's most controversial policies include: a) gutting the federal workforce of nonpartisan civil servants and replacing them with Trump loyalists; b) dismantling the Department of Education and ending all low-income and early education federal programs, including Head Start; c) putting the FBI and the Justice Department under presidential control and giving the president power to investigate his opponents; d) criminalizing people who provide abortions, making reproductive care hard to get, and denying women emergency contraception and no-cost birth control coverage; and carrying out mass deportations of anyone who can't prove their legal status in the US.
