One-Minute Madness

Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes

Number of players: Unlimited

Supplies needed: Pencils and paper

Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

How many **NAMES OF LAKES** (located anywhere in the world) can you come up with in one minute?

Instructions:

1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
2. Read the question aloud. Discussion is permitted among teammates.
3. Set a timer to one minute (which you can extend to two minutes or more if your players prefer). When the timer goes off, all pencils must be put down.
4. Choose the first team or individual to read aloud their list of lakes. The following teams/individuals should read any lake that wasn't mentioned by a previous player.
5. The team/individual with the most correct answers wins the game.
