

5/26/24 One-Minute Madness

Estimated play time: Approximately 15 minutes Number of players: Unlimited Supplies needed: Pencils and paper Suitable for visually impaired players.

Overview:

How many **NAMES OF LAKES** (located anywhere in the world) can you come up with in one minute?

Instructions:

- 1. This game can be played by individuals or in teams.
- 2. Read the question aloud. Discussion is permitted among teammates.
- 3. Set a timer to one minute (which you can extend to two minutes or more if your players prefer). When the timer goes off, all pencils must be put down.
- 4. Choose the first team or individual to read aloud their list of lakes. The following teams/individuals should read any lake that wasn't mentioned by a previous player.
- 5. The team/individual with the most correct answers wins the game.



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Instructions: How many NAMES OF LAKES (located anywhere in the world) can you come up with in one minute?
