Overview:

Instructions

- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

HOLIDAYS & OBSERVANCE DAYS

- 10 Pts On the second weekend in May, this country observes National Windmill Day.
- 20 Pts In Pamplona, Spain, the annual Fiesta de San Fermin is celebrated with this event, in which 50 to 100 people are injured each year.
- 30 Pts In 1999, New Hampshire was the last US state to make this January day a paid state holiday.
- 40 Pts Surprisingly, Congress made this an official holiday in 1938, though it marks an event that occurred 162 years earlier.
- 50 Pts Eid ul-Fitr (EED AL FIT•ter) marks the end of this month of fasting for Muslims.

ZERO

- 10 Pts This American actor is widely associated with the role of Tevye in Broadway's Fiddler on the Roof—although he didn't get the role in the 1971 movie.
- 20 Pts Originally, this term was used for the spot where a nuclear bomb exploded. Today, it often refers to a place where something, usually awful, has happened.
- 30 Pts Weightlessness, as NASA might express it.
- 40 Pts This is the lowest temperature that is theoretically possible.
- 50 Pts In the 1960s, this term was coined to describe a system in which the number of babies born is limited to only the number needed to replace the existing people.
