Overview:

You already know how to play trivia quizzes. Here are a few additional ideas to consider if you want a more, or less, competitive game.

Instructions

- 1. Create a tournament format in which permanent teams compete in playoffs and a final champion team is crowned.
- 2. Collect a small amount of money from each player (for example, 50 cents or a dollar) and put it into a kitty. The winning team splits the kitty.
- 3. Buy some lottery tickets to use as prizes for the winners (and runners up).
- 4. To create a less competitive game, just give one point for every question answered.

QUESTIONS

FOUNDING FATHERS

- 10 Pts He started building Monticello in 1770 but didn't complete it until 1809 after he left the presidency.
- 20 Pts Although today a very popular beer is named after this founding father, he was not known as a brewer in the 18th century, but rather a maltster, who made the malt that brewers used to make beer.
- 30 Pts The portrait of this Founding Father and first Secretary of the Treasury graces the \$10 bill.
- 40 Pts The wife of this Founding Father implored him to "remember the ladies" as he went about the business of constructing a new government. He didn't!
- 50 Pts in 1778, this US naval hero captured the *Drake*, the first British ship to be defeated by an American ship.

STEPFATHERS

- 10 Pts When he married Martha Dandridge Custis in 1759, he became stepfather to her son and daughter.
- 20 Pts In 1991, he became infamous when he began a relationship (and eventually married) his stepdaughter, Soon-Yi Previn.
- 30 Pts It's likely that this husband (whose wife was, according to the Bible, an eternal virgin) is the most famous stepfather in history.
- 40 Pts Three months before William Jefferson Blythe III was born in 1946, his father died in a car accident. He assumed his stepfather's last name in 1950.
- 50 Pts At different times Gore Vidal and this First Lady had the same stepfather ... Hugh Auchincloss.

GRANDFATHERS

- 10 Pts This president's grandfather was the mayor of Boston from 1901 to 1914.
- 20 Pts In 1933 American actor Frank Shields, the grandfather of this actress, was ranked No. 1 world amateur tennis player.
- 30 Pts This character in *Roots* was Alex Haley's great-great-great-great grandfather.
- 40 Pts This grandfather, the 34th president of the United States, named Camp David (the presidential retreat in Frederick County, Maryland), after his grandson ... and his father.
- 50 Pts In 1900, his grandfather bought him a farmhouse near Derry, New Hampshire. It was where he wrote much of his poetry.



DAD WORDS AND PHRASES

- 10 Pts The small lobster-like crustaceans that are a staple of Cajun cooking are known by many nicknames, including mudbugs, yabbies, mudpuppies, and this paternal nickname.
- 20 Pts This type of spider has a tiny body and long spindly legs that make it appear much larger than it actually is.
- 30 Pts Originally called the "Papa Sucker" when it was introduced in 1925, this brand of lollipop is basically a rectangular caramel slab on a stick.
- 40 Pts In 1958, this Caribbean Island, along with the much smaller nearby island of Tobago, was granted self-governance and independence from the United Kingdom.
- 50 Pts The Danny Thomas Show, a long-running sitcom from the 1950s and 1960s in which Danny Thomas played nightclub entertainer Danny Williams, was originally known by this title during its first three seasons.

- 10 Pts This comic strip character, who was introduced in 1929, didn't derive his superhuman powers from spinach until 1932.
- 20 Pts This Nobel Prize-winning author of *The Old Man and the Sea* and *The Sun Also Rises* was nicknamed Papa.
- 30 Pts Yorkshire Pudding, the traditional English side dish, is known by this name in America.
- 40 Pts The oldest definitive evidence of this key ingredient in Crackerjacks was discovered in New Mexico and dated back to 3600 BC.
- This flowering plant, often grown for its colorful blooms, is the source of the narcotic drug mixture opium.
